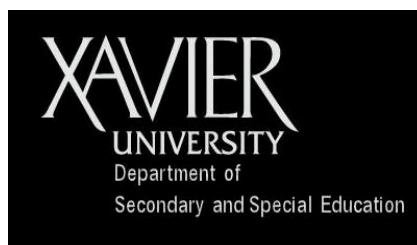
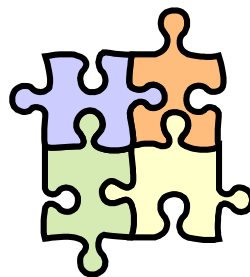

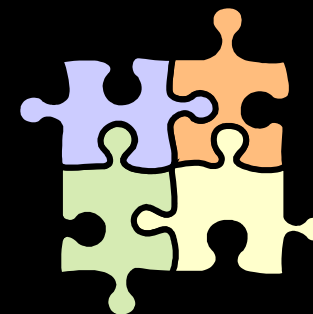

**Monday, August 2, 2010**

**Brenda Smith Myles, PhD**

Dr. Brenda Smith Myles is Director of Programs at the Autism Society. The recipient of the 2004 Autism Society Outstanding Professional Award, she has written numerous publications on Asperger Syndrome and Autism including *The Hidden Curriculum* and *Asperger Syndrome and Adolescence Practical Solutions for School Success* (with Adreon). Brenda was also the winner of the 2002 Autism Society Outstanding Literary Work. She is on the executive boards of several organizations, including the Organization for Autism Research.



**Tuesday, August 3, 2010**

**Robert Naseef, PhD**

Dr. Robert Naseef is a psychologist, author, and parent of an adult son with autism. He is author of *Special Children, Challenged Parents* (1997) and the co-editor of *Voices from the Spectrum* (2006). In his Philadelphia, PA practice, Robert specializes in working with families with autism and he has made numerous media appearances.

**Rena Sorensen-Burnworth, PhD**

Dr. Rena Sorensen-Burnworth is a staff psychologist with The Kelly O'Leary Center for Autism at Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center and Director of their Severe Behavior Treatment Program. Dr. Sorensen-Burnworth came to CCHMC from the Kennedy Krieger Institute and the John Hopkins School of Medicine, where she specialized in behavioral assessment and treatment of persons with developmental disabilities, severe behavior, and pediatric feeding disorders.



**Thursday, August 5, 2010**

**Julie Gentile, MD**

Dr. Gentile is an assistant professor at Wright State University, Department of Psychiatry, near Dayton, Ohio. She is the psychiatrist for the Montgomery County Board of DODD Mental Health Program and Medical Director for the Ohio Coordinating Center of Excellence in Dual Diagnosis (mental illness and developmental disabilities). She provides psychiatric assessments for dual-diagnosis for individuals in the western region of Ohio. She is active in the training of medical and psychiatry residents.
